About city and environment.

I've spent 5 beautiful months on Sardinia in Cagliari doing my Erasmus+ student exchange programme at Università degli studi di Cagliari(eng. The University of Cagliari). I would definitely recommend this place for those people who are looking for a very active and entertaining life, because this city and people in there giving this opportunity. The place itself is very beautiful, also it's a big amount of places to visit near Cagliari, where you can find beautiful beaches and towns with old Spanish-Italian architecture. The Sardinian community will very surprise you, because people there are very mind open, cheerful and always ready to meet some new people, have fun with them and make some long term relationships.

About University.

University department which is responsible for international students contains of 2 general parts. First consists of the students which are studying in the University and they are responsible for helping with accommodation, organizing events and selling tickets for Erasmus people(which are a lot) and answering any sort of being in Cagliari questions(like bus tickets or "where to buy food questions"). Second consists with University workers, which are responsible for your documents and studying related questions and they are always ready to help for you with any questions you have, the most important is to find time and don't be afraid(or shy) to ask. Based on what faculty you're studying you will get the university's professor which calls 'tutor' who will help you with all your learning agreement problems or questions, classes schedules etc.

About education system.

Obviously education system and teaching techniques are quite different from those we have in University of Economy in Bydgoszcz. Compare to our University they have less subjects to be taught, however amount of hours is a lot bigger for each, which gives you an opportunity to learn the chosen subjects more deeply. Also as mechatronics field student I had a lot of self projects to work on, which was something new and challenging for me, but it was interesting and new experience gaining. One of the problem in studying was language. Although they were supposed to be taught in English, some of them were in Italian, which is kind of hard if you don't speak Italian. But in those cases, professors are very ready to help, they'll give you all the materials you need to study in English version, also some links where you can join some online courses taught in English, answer your questions if you have some and obviously all exams and tests are in English. Also you will get a chance to attend the Italian language course, which is rather cheep and as too me on decent level. In case you will be attending classes and making some efforts at home, you can learn Italian from A0 to, at least, A2 level. From those who already has Italian language skills, higher level classes(B1,B2) also exist.
